Orthodox Jewish tradition understands dress as an outward manifestation of respectfulness and modesty, reflected in the attire of both men and women. Men wear long pants, shirts with sleeves, and a kippah. Women wear dresses or skirts below the knee and shirts with sleeves and modest necklines.

Adherence to these standards in all academic and religious spaces contributes to a positive campus culture. Dressing with care is one way we show respect for our institution, and it honors the Torah environment we are building together.
